


Lymington Yacht Haven Guide

Finding the marina

Nestling on the edge of the New Forest, Lymington Yacht Haven is situated very close to the mouth of the beautiful Lymington river and provides easy access to the Western Solent and beyond. The charming town centre is approximately ten minutes' walk from the marina and offers cafes, pubs, restaurants and a lovely range of shops.

Exit the M27 at Junction 1, following signs for Lymington on the A337. At Lymington, the marina directions are indicated on brown tourist signs, initially as Marinas & Riverside, and then as Yacht Haven. By exiting the M27 at Junction 2, one can reach Lymington via Beaulieu, avoiding the potential bottleneck at Lyndhurst during the busy season.

A regular half hourly train service runs from the main line station of Brockenhurst through to Lymington Town. The marina is then a 20 minute walk from the station.

Car Parking and Obtaining / Returning Boat Keys

Park or stop near to the marina office (in the same building as The Haven Bar/Restaurant), and head for marina reception (upstairs). Collect and sign for the relevant boat keys (ask by boat name and give your name), car park/facility entry fob (are on the key ring) and ask for the current marina toilet / WIFI codes and check the boat berth number.

The office is open 24 hours a day, but off peak there is only one staff member. When he/she does pontoon walks, the office is locked so you'll need to call their mobile (displayed on the office door) and they will return to the office.

Finding your boat



There are no reciprocal berthing agreements with other Yacht Haven marinas in our cruising area.

Mooring guidance

Tidal conditions at the mooring are not challenging but please note a small cross tide can run across the berth during the ebb and flood – most noticeable at Springs.

To the SE side of O pontoon is a break water. Note that a mud bank extends from the breakwater towards O pontoon – visible at low water (pictured) not at high water. The channel between O pontoon and the mud bank is dredged to 2.5m. Stay at least 10 meters away from the breakwater at all times. The depth transducer reads from the bow, extra care must be taken when going astern or turning not to ground the rudder.



The berth is exposed to winds from the South, and to a lesser extent, the Western quadrant so please bear in mind when berthing. Assuming the prevailing SW airflow is present, you will be blown onto the finger berth.

WIFI

WIFI service is available in the marina. Ask in the marina office for WIFI code details.

Showers and Toilets

Shower and toilet facilities are located on the pontoon (H/K) pier, next to the berth holder's car park and in the main marina building. Access is with the security fob OR security code obtained from the marina office and it changes weekly. Hairdryers are available

Refuse and Recycling

Refuse and recycling bins are available in the berth holder car park and next to the main marina building. Please use these for disposal of domestic refuse and do not leave it on the pontoons.

Provisioning

There is a Waitrose, Tesco and M&S Food in Lymington town centre open 7 days a week.

Onsite food and drink

Located next door to the Marina Reception, The Haven offers fabulous food & drink with reach-reaching views over the marina and the Solent. With full height, glazed windows and an extended terrace, you can sit back and enjoy your sundowners with views all the way to the Isle of Wight.

Throughout the year, The Haven offer sailor's breakfasts, specialty teas & coffee with homemade cakes, lunches and dinners. Their renowned seafood specials are also available, subject to the catch of the day!

Open from 8.00am through to midnight every day in the summer, and open from 9.00am during the winter months.

Local food and drink

There are many pubs and restaurants located a short walk away in the village. We recommend the following pubs, all of which serve food: The Mayflower and The King's Head as two of our favourites.

Cash Point

There are plenty of cash points in the town centre.

Chandlery

Nick Cox chandlery is located at the entrance to the marina. We have an account for bottled gas refills.

Fuel Pontoon

The fuel berth is located next to the main marina building in the corner of the marina.

VHF Radio Channels

Lymington Yacht Haven uses channel 80.

Designated Sail Area

Charts are provided for the Solent and west to Poole and St Alban's head. Please provide your own charts for areas outside this and advise Pure Latitude of your passage plan in advance.
